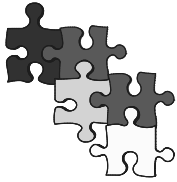

BAILEY'S TEAM COMMITS \$53,000 TO 13 PROJECTS FROM MONEY RAISED IN 2010!

Bailey's Team has been raising money in support of autism research, awareness and programming since 2001. This year, we have not only funded 13 projects amounting to nearly \$53,000, but we have also committed an additional \$9,000 to future projects that will be allocated later this year or added to funds raised in 2011 to be allocated in 2012!

We have formalized our funding procedure and have established the following guidelines:

- All requests must be specifically and primarily in support of people with autism and/or their families.
- Projects must fit into one of the following categories:
 - Research
 - Education and training
 - Family support and resources
 - Programming and recreation
- Who will benefit from said programs?
 - Individuals with autism
 - Parents and other family members of individuals with autism
 - Educators and/or other service people who support individuals living with ASD and their families [first responders, respite providers, etc].
- All submissions will be reviewed by the Board of Directors for final vote to fund project requests in part or in total.
- Reporting required at completion of funded program.

It continues to be one of our goals that we remain transparent as we share with all of you where every dollar is spent. We want you to not only be a part of our team, but also to have a solid understanding of our funding process and confidence in our mission and our ability to make good decisions about where your money goes. We will continue to support research, awareness, programming and education for our loved ones with autism, their families and their communities and hope that you continue to believe in our mission and support our efforts to improve the lives of people struggling with this devastating disorder!

We've had a great year loving and supporting Bailey and he has continued to amaze us learning new skills and accomplishing milestones... one day at a time!

Bailey is in the 5th grade and this year he has been included up to two hours each day with his typical peers in a typical 5th grade classroom! This is an enormous accomplishment as Bailey has not been included alongside his peers for a significant amount of time ever before! Children are truly resilient and his classmates have become his best advocates – always looking out for him and encouraging him to be a part of their group!

This year, mainly as a result of his inclusion, Bailey was invited for a "play date" for the very first time! I didn't know what to do or say since this has never happened before (for Bailey), and as a result, I neglected to ask if his friend had any pets (Bailey has significant allergies to animals). When we arrived at his classmate's house, I had to plan for a short visit since there were cats and dogs in the home. Aside from Bailey's congestion, the hour was magnificent! There was very little conversational turn-taking; however, Bailey's playmate taught him a new (video) game. The game progressed nicely and Bailey was able to interact successfully with his new friend...what a day for both boys!

Another example of Bailey participating alongside his peers was his successful inclusion in a recent ceremony honoring students who completed our local DARE program (Drug Abuse Resistance Education). Although Bailey's understanding of the curriculum was obviously different than that of the other children, his lessons were adapted to a level that he could comprehend enabling him to participate. As a result, he was able to graduate along with the entire 5th grade class! Both Bailey and longtime friend, Elijah (another student with similar challenges), are pictured below following the ceremony.

We continue to receive visits from none other than... "*Johnny the Mailman*" as we have kept up with our collection of characters – this time the characters of choice are Sing-a-ma-jigs! We have all seventeen currently available and are keeping up with Bailey's collection to keep the peace! Unfortunately, he finds newly developed toys on YouTube before they are available for purchase which creates quite a challenge as he does not understand that if he can see it – why he can't get it! It is very hard to explain to Bailey how things work and what we *can* and *cannot* do in our world to get what we want!

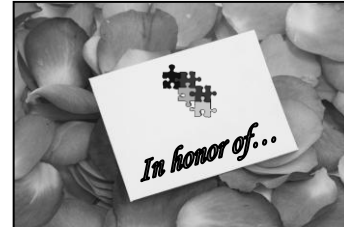


TRIBUTE CARDS

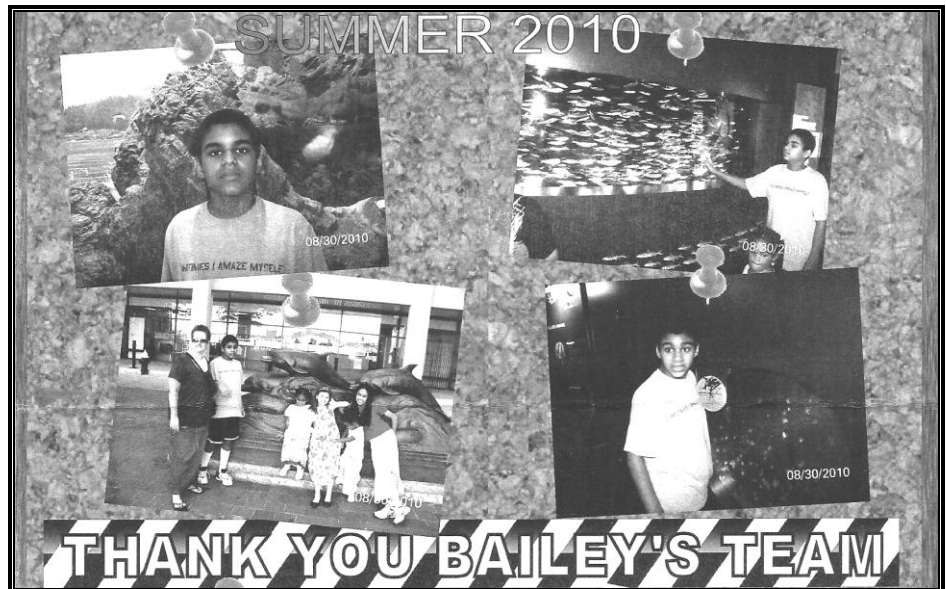

2010 FUNDING HIGHLIGHTS

BROWN CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF CHILDREN AT RISK: \$10,500 to fund a research study that will help to identify very early infant signs of autism in children observed from birth.

THE ARC OF NORTHERN BRISTOL COUNTY: \$5,000 to fund Project Kids Connect (PKC), a program fostering inclusion for youth with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) and other disabilities; and encouraging healthy relationships with non-disabled peers for cultural, educational or recreational activities. Objectives include increasing awareness and acceptance of youth with challenges; providing low cost and/or free services to families who have a child with a disability; and teaching life-skills.

COMMUNITY AUTISM RESOURCES: \$5,000 to fund More Than Words (Hanan), a workshop led by a specially trained Hanen Instructor that offers the best tools, strategies and resources to help support parents' involvement in their child's early language intervention. This class is offered specifically to parents and family members of children with ASD to help them better understand their children with autism and to help them learn to facilitate communication at home.

DR. BARRY PRIZANT & COMMUNITY AUTISM RESOURCES: \$5,000 to fund an annual Parent Retreat for parents of children with autism. The retreat provides a relaxing and supportive environment for parents or caregivers to reflect on, explore, and share the rewards and challenges of raising a child with autism. There are opportunities for discussion, social support networking, making new friends and learning from other parents in a beautiful country setting. Although there are opportunities to learn, the format is that of a retreat as the atmosphere is relaxed and casual, in stark contrast to the everyday stresses of raising a child with autism.

BAILEY'S TEAM EDUCATION SERIES: \$5,000 to fund two (2) individual programs featuring speakers who will present on a variety of topics – all on the subject of autism. The funds will support the cost of each event and will include marketing and materials to be distributed. Our featured speakers for our 2011 Education Series include Paul LaCava, Ph.D. & Amy Laurent, EdM, OTR/L.

THE AUTISM PROJECT: \$4,000 to support development of a pilot social skills group for adults with ASD. Participants will make significant gains in the area of perspective taking as the program helps to teach the social expectations of being a part of a group in a very concrete manner. This knowledge is necessary for individuals with high functioning autism and Asperger Syndrome to function in the workplace and participants will gain skills to make them more successful in their home, school and/or place of employment.

BAILEY'S ANIMAL ADVENTURE: \$4,000 to fund a family event for individuals of all abilities to participate in a welcoming and safe environment with their peers – with and without similar challenges.

BIG ORANGE FILMS: \$3,600 to fund two weeks of editing for the documentary film project, Learning from Autism.

THE GRODEN NETWORK: \$3,000 to fund a Tai Chi class for adults with autism offered to residents of the Groden Network's Cove Center.

KENNEDY-DONOVAN CENTER, NEW BEDFORD: \$3,000 to support the New Bedford Families with Autism Support Network (FASN). FASN will assist financially disadvantaged families who need support in caring for their children age 30-60 months who have autism spectrum disorders through direct family support, recreational programs, social skills training, and other opportunities that will improve the quality of their lives. In addition, FASN will offer toddlers and preschool-age children with autism and family members advocacy and educational opportunities that provide practical experience.

AUTISM PROJECT – IMAGE WALK & FAMILY FUN DAY: \$2,500 sponsorship to be allocated to various programs and training for individuals living with autism and their families.

THE SCHWARTZ CENTER FOR CHILDREN: \$1,800 to fund two scholarships for (two) children to attend Family University, a program comprised of social skills groups for children on the autism spectrum, as well as educational opportunities for their parents and siblings.

AUTISM SOCIETY OF AMERICA – RHODE ISLAND CHAPTER / THE GRODEN NETWORK: \$500 to fund programming offered by both the Groden Network and the Autism Society of America – Rhode Island Chapter.
