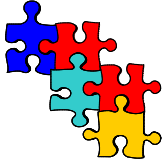

Bailey's Team for Autism is pleased to announce the launch of our 2021 - 2022 funding cycle, which will begin immediately (today, August 2, 2021). Please note that we will now accept proposals thru October 1st, 2021. Our Board of Directors will review proposals in January and February and grantees will be notified no later than March 1st of 2022.

Bailey's Team has been raising funds and providing grants to non-profit organizations since 2001 and to date we have raised over \$1.3 million in support of individuals with autism spectrum disorders and their families. Our priority areas for funding include programming & recreation, education & training, research, and family support & resources. We do our best to select projects that support all ages of individuals on the autism spectrum in addition to those who support them including parents and other family members of individuals with autism, and educators & other service providers. Please note that we do not provide direct financial assistance to families or individuals.

Priority will be given to projects with complete and detailed submissions demonstrating impact and/or ability to measure results. Expected outcomes should be clearly identified as well as a detailed budget and plans for execution. Bailey's Team looks to fund projects that are able to begin implementation as a result of funding – whether we are the sole source or part of a larger collaborative funding effort where additional funds have already been identified and secured. A thorough report including measurable outcomes, data collection and results will be expected at the end of the grant cycle along with a detailed breakdown of how the awarded funds were used.
