A Message from the President FAMILY UPDATE

Dear Friends,

Another great year... 2014 brought us more milestone celebrations including our 5th annual Education Series along with our 10th annual Bailey's Par Charity Golf Tournament! We continue to thrive raising funds in support of our mission allowing us to support important programs for people with autism and their families. Please read on to hear about our events, our celebrations and a little bit about our very special Bailey!

Bailey will be 15 on October 2nd and entered his first year at North Attleboro High School! What else is there to say? This has taken a lot of time to digest! © It seems like only yesterday we were receiving his diagnosis 13 years ago although the years of tremendous struggle (thankfully) become a bit more of a blur with each year that passes.

Bailey is doing wonderfully. His use of appropriate language continues to slowly increase and even some *inappropriate* (teenage) language has shown it's ugly face; however, very typical... and very exciting! This is the first year that he and Rachel are in the same school as she is a senior and he is a freshman. Also due to Rachel's involvement in the Best Pals program at the High School supporting individuals of all abilities, she often visits his in class and at lunch while helping to support his classmates. He enjoys seeing his sister and it has provided her the opportunity to see him in a new environment that is very difficult for all of us to imagine. Fortunately, when it is time for Rachel to graduate, Spencer will arrive at the High School just in time next September to keep an eye on his big brother.

Bailey is now 5 feet, 2 inches tall and taller than mom (not hard to do), however, he will still walk while snuggling out to the bus every morning. Although this may not seem like typical or appropriate teenage behavior, it pleases me to no end to know that I cannot embarrass him! After all, he loves us all very much and is not afraid to show it... something we wish from all of our children!

This year, our new adventures with Bailey included preparing and sending him to his first dance at the Middle School. Although he went stag, he did spend most of his time with his best girl – friend Celya; and although she went with a date, she spent most of her time with Bailey (see pictured below).

Another adventure was a very special surfing event in Narragansett, Rhode Island. "Surfers Healing" is a spectacular event developed by a father of a son with autism to support individuals living with autism and their families. He created a surfing program that is now giving children with autism an opportunity to learn to surf on the waters of more than 15 different beaches throughout the United States creating a wonderful sensory treat as many children with autism enjoy the water. For some, it creates a sensory balance and affects a child's behavior and disposition throughout the day (see pictures of Bailey enjoying the surf on page 5).

We also enjoyed our weekends as well as two full weeks in August in Chatham on Cape Cod. Bailey enjoys the Cape Cod House and although he doesn't spend much of his time at the beach or outside, he does enjoy this alternate setting with the family, at restaurants and especially his frequent visits to the Hyannis Toys 'R Us!!

As I've mentioned, his birthday is a bittersweet time for us, as we must remind him of the day and his age. He does become excited that it is approaching and he knows what to expect in the way of gifts and a celebration of some kind. He continues to enjoy childlike videos and loves reciting the same words or phrases over and over again. He also enjoys making us all recite his favorite words and sound effects. He still loves music and Mario games and plush dolls. He is almost always happy – but our biggest challenge continues to be the sudden loss of Internet service at home, at the Cape, in the car and in the community. If our Internet service goes down intermittently and Bailey cannot access the web, we are all at risk of his very loud outbursts or tantrums.

As Bailey gets older and continues to mature, we look forward to more wonderful adventures with him, while also always preparing ourselves for what lies ahead relative to his autism.

BAILEY'S TEAM HOLDS FIFTH EDUCATION SERIES WELCOMING BOTH SUSAN CONSTABLE & STEPHEN SHORE BACK TO THE FRONT OF THE ROOM!

In April and May of this year, we welcomed two very important speakers back to our program. Sue Constable, who first spoke on the subject of Inclusion & Acceptance (along with Janet McTarnaghan) in 2010, spoke to a full room on <u>Using Positive & Practical Strategies to Develop Social & Emotional Skills in Children with ASD</u>. Feedback was tremendous as Sue was able to provide hands on strategies for both educators and family members supporting individuals with autism.

Stephen Shore, who first spoke on the subject of what it is like to be autistic, returned to speak on the subject of **Autism & Bullying: A Vulnerable Population**, and how individuals with autism can be easy targets.

Bailey's Team has hosted these lectures in an effort to provide opportunities to all who are interested to learn more about individuals with autism and how to best support them – at home and at school. As school and state budgets continue to be cut – year after year – decreasing the funds available to support special education programming and resources available to families, we felt it necessary to contribute to a very special population that continues to grow as funds continue to decrease.


