## A Message from the President FAMILY UPDATE

Dear Friends,

2015 is proving to be our best year yet already having raised over \$70,000 with three (3) more months to go! We continue to host well attended programs – both in an effort to raise funds AND awareness in support of people with autism spectrum disorders and their families!

October 2<sup>nd</sup> is approaching quickly and this year it is rather bittersweet. Our handsome Bailey will be 16 years old. Although it has been and continues to be a happy time for us all, it is always difficult to celebrate a milestone birthday, as it reminds us of what Bailey can't or will never do. At 16, most teenagers would be preparing and anxious to get their learner's permit to drive before their 17<sup>th</sup> birthday. We are spoiling him with birthday gifts that include the recent Disney/Pixar movie characters from "Inside Out." The bright side... one less kid we have to worry about behind the wheel, out at all hours, and driving all over! Not really the bright side for us, but that is what we tell ourselves.

Bailey continues to grow taller; yet he thinks he is very small. He will not hesitate to enter a room and drop his 100 lb. body on either one of our laps. He curls up in a ball, although still manages unintentionally to crush us. He has always been so affectionate and yes, he still asks for butterfly kisses at age 16!

Bailey has entered his sophomore year at North Attleboro High School (NAHS) where his brother, Spencer, recently joined him as a freshman. It was perfect timing that Rachel was nearby for Bailey's first year with Spencer arriving immediately following her departure. It certainly gives us a level of comfort knowing that he does not feel alone. His use of language continues to increase, however, he constantly uses words and phrases from movies and youtube to communicate. He also has a tendency to mix up phrases and when called from another room he will yell "I'll be right here mom..." instead of "I'll be right there mom!" The first time I heard this – it was so wonderful to hear what was nearly a typical response; but still he got it wrong – of course something we do not plan to correct... it is simply a "Baileyism." Other Baileyisms include "action finger" ("action figure"), "100 sodas – be right back – go get them" (when we are out of his favorite diet root beer and orange soda), "Do you like McDonald's" (this means "I want McDonalds for dinner!")... and there are many more.

Just two weeks ago we returned to Narragansett Beach for a day of surfing! We were introduced to this wonderful program last year and this year Bailey had much success getting up on the surfboard. "Surfers Healing" is a spectacular event developed to support individuals living with autism and their families. It was created by a father of a son with autism and it is now giving children with autism an opportunity to learn to surf on the waters of more than 15 different beaches throughout the United States creating a wonderful sensory experience (read more about this program on page 4).

This year, Bailey's at-home services therapist, who comes to us through a grant from the state, has taught him many daily living skills. Lisa seems to work almost effortlessly with him as he has a tremendous respect for her and reponds well to her direction and teaching. He has learned to make his bed, clean his room, sort through his favorite (hundreds of) drawings and at age 16, I am happy to say he can tie his shoes! He showers almost independently, yet still has difficulty staying on task.

He is almost always happy – still frustrated, however, by the sudden loss of Internet service at home, at the Cape, in the car and in the community. If he is unable to access Youtube or complete and <u>WIN</u> an online game, we are all at risk of his very loud outbursts. As he nears 17, we will begin the process of obtaining guardianship for him as at age 18 we no longer have the right to act as his guardian. He will become a ward of the state as an adult even though at times he functions as a child. We do look forward to our wonderful years and experiences ahead with him, but it is imperative that we are also always prepared for what lies ahead.
