A Message from the President FAMILY UPDATE

Dear Friends,

2016 has been a good year for Bailey's Team and for our family. However, it has not been without its challenges. Although we have continued to experience much success raising funds AND awareness in support of people on the autism spectrum, our own family continues to go through some difficult transitions as Bailey moves through puberty.

Bailey's 17th birthday is October 2nd and he is growing into a very handsome young man. He stands approximately 5' 6" tall and continues to charm us all. It's funny to see us walk out to the school bus at the end of our driveway each morning with him towering over me (not hard to do)... with his arm over my shoulder and his boyish grin as he starts his day. These are the precious moments! Thankfully, it seems that he will never embarrass from hugging his mom or dad – no matter who is watching!

With his growth, however, has come much strength. At times, when he becomes frustrated, his strength can become overpowering causing it to be difficult for us to help him de-escalate. As always, his biggest challenges (STILL) revolve around the Internet, video gaming and YouTube videos. His age and puberty does affect his temperament and as a result, his outbursts are louder and his reactions to his frustration or disappointment can be hard to manage.

We've had several experiences this summer that reminded us of just how difficult life can be supporting someone with autism. One example was the day that there was a sudden loss of Internet on the ferry to Martha's Vineyard, where Bailey's upset caused a very public display. It had been a long time since we experienced such a loud outburst as he continued to throw his ipad and phone, calling attention to us all and scaring those around us. On this day, however, it felt as though we took many steps backward and it was a "renewed" wake up call, that his autism was unmanageable and perhaps getting more and more difficult inhibiting our choices to spend time as a family in the community. Only weeks later, there was the sudden loss of Internet at home resulting in yet another devastated response as he was unable to continue watching his favorite YouTube videos. He became so agitated that he remained up through the night and threw a table across his bedroom. And most recently, there was his tremendous disappointment that resulted from his receiving a wrong edition of a Baby Bach video. We watched him as he worked so hard to manage his sadness, but his temper got the best of him and he sobbed for hours, exerting his strength and attempting to hurt himself and break toys and other items in his path. These are the hard parts and only a few examples of what has transpired this summer.

Bailey has entered his junior year at North Attleboro High School (NAHS). His use of language continues to increase, however, he constantly uses words and phrases from movies and youtube to communicate. He spends a lot of his time in the community with support from his teachers and aides. He works at our local Food Pantry, St. Vincent DiPaul's and the Wrentham Development Center labeling towels in their laundry room. He goes to the supermarket and prepares meals at school with his classmates. He enjoys his time at school and has learned how to behave there.

Every morning is the start of a brand new day when we embrace our son, accept and love him for who he is and hope for only good things to come. Most days continue this way. And although this summer proved to be more difficult, we are hopeful that as he learns more skills, he will become more manageable at home.

We know that he loves us very much and never means to hurt anyone. His autism is what controls his behavior and although in many ways he has learned to respond as teenagers do, we must remember that he is often like a very young child continuing to grow into a man's body. However, no matter how hard it gets, we will do our best to support him and make sure that he remains happy and always knows that he is loved.

BAILEY'S TEAM FUNDS A NEW INITIATIVE AT THE J. ARTHUR TRUDEAU MEMORIAL CENTER





Earlier this year, Bailey's Team funded a special new project at the Pathways Strategic Teaching Center, a comprehensive education and treatment program serving children with autism and related disorders. Founded in 1998 through a collaborative effort between the J. Arthur Trudeau Memorial Center and local parents of children with autism, Pathways is committed to utilizing scientifically validated teaching strategies in improving the lives of children with autism and their families.

The funds from Bailey's Team were put forth to open a school store, "Pathways Place" (pictured at left) on the Coventry campus, to provide a structured environment where transition students could work on skills needed for employment. This includes understanding money, counting, communication and stocking shelves as well as going into the community to purchase supplies for the store. In addition, the school store will give all Pathways students a chance to work on life skills when purchasing items.

Bailey's Team was happy to participate in this initiative as it supports young people with autism and helps them to acquire the skills they will need to become valued and contributing members of their respective communities.
