# A Message from the President FAMILY UPDATE

Dear Friends,

In looking back at last year's spring newsletter, I had written about the overabundance of snow and freezing temperatures not to mention "no school" announcements. At the risk of sounding redundant and having an even worse winter with even more snowfall, all I can say (again) is... ENOUGH!

2014 was a great year as we celebrated more milestone events including our 10<sup>th</sup> annual Bailey's Par Charity Golf Tournament which raised a record breaking \$35,500; and our 5<sup>th</sup> annual Education Series which welcomed over 200 parents, educators, therapists and other patrons interested in learning how to better support individuals living with autism and their families!

2014 was also a great year for the Robertson family. Bailey made a very smooth transition to North Attleboro High School where he is a freshman and continues to be in a "substantially separate" classroom with four other classmates with autism and other intellectual & developmental disabilities. Thankfully he is using more language in his attempt to communicate and continues to surprise us every day! He is now 15, yet his interests remain the same... spending time on the computer, ipad, "daddy's phone" and of course the Wii. This is where he is able to explore through video and gaming. He loves YouTube and searches for a variety of oddities that seem to amuse him like crying babies, people falling or crashing, strange noises... and there is always Mario and friends.

Now that Bailey is in High School, our job is to continue to consider his future, but instead of focusing on school transitions it is now time to think of adulthood as his academic curriculum will slowly change to one of teaching life skills. He will learn about money, self-care and other skills that will help him to function as an adult. It is a difficult time for those of us who support him as the reality of his abilities and disabilities become more apparent as we prepare for the future.

Bailey continues to be happy. He follows his routines as they pertain to going to school, afterschool activities including time on the computer and bowling, and also bedtime. We have, however, had a difficult time getting him to eat a balanced diet and expand on the foods he will eat. As a result of this we have consulted with his school team and also his at-home therapist in addition to his doctor, and as a result, we have slowly implemented an eating exercise that presents a small quantity of several different items as if it were a game (see picture below of muffin tin containing 12 different food items). Although this continues to be quite a challenge, we have slowly gotten him to eat small portions of fruits and vegetables and meats. There is nothing better than watching someone eat who you have feared could ultimately become malnourished!

Bailey's sister, Rachel, participates with him at school as she is a "Best Pal" and helps to support people with developmental disabilities. She visits his class weekly and Bailey really enjoys his time with her. This is the first and only year they will attend school together so for him this has been a treat. Rachel will graduate this year, however, Spencer will be transitioning to the High School next year always providing sibling support at school!

Bailey continues to grow into a very handsome young man who smiles almost all of the time. He brings us all so much joy as his smallest accomplishments are monumental to the rest of us! We hope you enjoy the pictures below from the past year!

### BAILEY'S TEAM FEATURES ARTWORK BY JOHNNY MCKENNA



At our 6<sup>th</sup> annual Wine, Spirits & Beer Tasting held in November of 2014, we featured a very special art display. Johnny McKenna, (pictured left) is a 24-year-old man with autism who resides in Rhode Island with his parents. He is very talented in drawing, painting and photography. In 2009, Providence Mayor David Cicilline presented him with an Outstanding Achievement Award in Photography and currently his art is displayed throughout New England.

In an effort to contribute to Bailey's Team, Johnny chose to donate several pieces of artwork that were offered for sale with proceeds to benefit individuals living with autism and their families. These pieces were painted in 2013 & 2014 and were all dated and signed, "Johnny."



#### **2014 FUNDING HIGHLIGHTS**

**AUTISM PROJECT – SOCIAL SKILLS PROGRAMMING:** \$8,000 to be allocated to programs designed to teach children and teens with ASD how to communicate and to be part of a group while developing the skills they need to enter the community.

SOUTH COAST EDUCATIONAL COLLABORATIVE: \$6,000 to fund More Than Words™ (a Hanen Program®), a workshop led by a specially trained Hanen Instructor that offers the best tools, strategies and resources to help support parents' involvement in their child's early language intervention. This class is offered specifically to parents and family members of children with ASD to help them better understand their children with autism and to help them learn to facilitate communication at home.

**BAILEY'S ANIMAL ADVENTURE:** \$6,000 to fund a family event at Roger Williams Park Zoo for individuals of all abilities to participate in a welcoming and safe environment with their peers – with and without similar challenges.

**UNIQUE STEPS DANCE STUDIO DANCE THERAPY / SOUND EQUIPMENT:** \$5,000 to support the cost of therapeutic dance classes and new audio and sensory equipment to provide individuals with ASD the opportunity to enjoy the art of dance, as well as the therapeutic benefits of movement.

**ARTISTS' EXCHANGE PROGRAM:** \$4,800 to fund an art program offered to individuals with ASD in an inclusive environment teaching art skills and knowledge while also providing sensory experiences through the work of clay.

**BAILEY'S TEAM EDUCATION SERIES:** \$4,500 to fund two (2) individual programs featuring our 2015 speakers, <u>Bill Cannata, ALEC Program Director</u>, who will speak about Emergency Preparedness; & <u>Holly S. Flanagan</u>, <u>MS. CCC-SLP</u>, who will speak about "Tuning In." Funds will support the cost of marketing, the venue and materials to be distributed.

**THE FRIENDSHIP NETWORK FOR CHILDREN:** \$3,865 to fund supplies & equipment to support social accessibility therapy groups for children, teens and young adults with autism spectrum disorders.

**THE GRODEN NETWORK / COVE CENTER:** \$3,150 to fund sound equipment for a music production and recording studio to serve adults with autism by enriching their experiences musically and teaching social and technological skills.

**KENNEDY-DONOVAN CENTER:** \$2,940 to fund the staffing portion of <u>More Than Words™</u> (a Hanen Program®) – see project description above under *South Coast Educational Collaborative*.

**<u>AUTISM ALLIANCE OF METROWEST:</u>** \$2,700 to fund gym equipment to support a weekly open gym program providing autism-friendly recreational activities.

**BRADLEY HOSPITAL SCHOOL PROGRAM:** \$2,400 to purchase six (6) iPad Minis and Otter Box cases to be used throughout the Bradley Hospital school program in support of individuals with autism (please see box below).

<u>AUTISM PROJECT – IMAGINE WALK & FAMILY FUN DAY:</u> \$1,000 sponsorship to be allocated to various programs and training for individuals living with autism and their families.

**SURFER'S HEALING:** \$1,000 sponsorship to be allocated to the Rhode Island day of surfing for kids with autism and other similar intellectual and developmental disabilities. [Please note that we mistakenly reported the amount contributed last year in our previous newsletter – the amount contributed was \$500.]

#### **IPAD INITIATIVE**

In November of 2012, we first introduced our iPad Initiative at our Wine & Beer Tasting event asking our attendees to help raise funds to support the purchase of iPADs to be used in programs supporting individuals with autism spectrum disorders.

This year, as a result of the generosity of our patrons, Bailey's Team will donate 6 iPad Minis and durable Otter Box cases to Bradley Hospital where they will be put to excellent use in their programs supporting individuals with autism. Bradley Schools are private, school-funded, educational programs for children and adolescents whose psychiatric and behavioral needs cannot be met in a public school setting. The programs are accredited by the Rhode Island and Massachusetts state departments of education and serve a high percentage of students with ASD.
